EARLE MAULDIN -- Board Chairman 2011-2012, Earle Mauldin is the former president and CEO of BellSouth Enterprises and Vice Chairman of BellSouth. Mauldin has served on the Hospital's Finance Committee for the past year and also as a member of the HCH Board of Directors. In addition to his service directly to the Hospital, he also chairs the Bob Jones Tournament Committee at Highlands Country Club, which each year raises approximately \$100,000 for the Foundation. Mr. Mauldin is also a member of the Highlands-Cashiers Chamber Music Board of Directors.
